CHICKASAW NATION LIFETIME HUNTING AND FISHING LICENSE

Chickasaw citizens can apply for a lifetime license to hunt and fish within the Chickasaw Nation. An Oklahoma state hunting and fishing license is not required to participate in this program.

Chickasaw citizens can submit an application at no cost. Additional eligibility requirements may apply.

LICENSEE PERMIT-TRIBAL LAND SPECIAL HUNT

Whitetail deer and turkey hunts on Chickasaw Nation-owned lands are available through a special draw. From the Kullihoma Hunting Grounds to other sections of land across the Chickasaw Nation, this special draw program offers hunters a chance to hunt more than 3,400 acres of prime hunting land.

FAQS

Q: What is the Five Tribes Wildlife Management Reciprocity Agreement?

A: In July 2024, the Cherokee Nation, Chickasaw Nation,

Choctaw Nation of Oklahoma,
Muscogee Nation, and Seminole Nation of
Oklahoma each signed an agreement to
accept each other's hunting and fishing
licenses, so a license from one of the Five
Tribes is valid in the reservation of the other
tribe. However, hunters and fishers must still
follow the specific rules of the tribe where they
are hunting or fishing and adhere to federal
laws. Citizens must also get permission before
hunting on private land or in wildlife
management areas.

Q: Who is eligible to hunt and fish within the Chickasaw Nation?

A: Chickasaw citizens, other participating Five Tribe members, and individuals with a valid state-issued license can hunt and fish within the Chickasaw Nation.

Q: What does a Chickasaw citizen need to carry to show they are licensed by the Chickasaw Nation?

A: Chickasaw citizens must carry their valid, tribally issued hunting and fishing license. Law enforcement is also authorized to accept a valid Oklahoma Department of Wildlife Conservation license if you have not yet gotten your Chickasaw license. If you receive any contrary guidance from a law enforcement officer in the field, be respectful but please contact us and let us know what happened. Chickasaw citizens are not exempt from federal wildlife regulations. You can apply for a license at

Are Chickasaw Nation Hunting and Fishing License holders required to purchase deer and turkey tags? How does a Chickasaw citizen check in a harvest?

A: Pre-purchased tags are not required; however, field tagging and check-ins are required. The Chickasaw Nation
Fish & Wildlife Service provides an online portal for Chickasaw citizens to report the harvest of any species with a check-in requirement.
Harvests are required to be reported within 24 hours to obtain a unique confirmation. More details are available at Chickasaw.net/Hunting.
