THE TWO-STORY, ALMOST 22,000 SQUARE-FOOT COMMUNITY CENTER WILL FEATURE A LARGE BANQUET HALL AND OFFER SEATING FOR UP TO 950 GUESTS.

SIMILAR TO CHICKASAW SENIOR CENTERS IN 12 SOUTH-CENTRAL OKLAHOMA COMMUNITIES; THE OKLAHOMA CITY SENIOR CENTER WILL INCLUDE A FULL-SERVICE KITCHEN AND LARGE DINING ROOM, A COMPUTER ROOM, AN EXERCISE ROOM, AND A CRAFT AND GAME ROOM.

AT THE SENIOR CENTERS, THE CHICKASAW NATION AGING PROGRAM OFFERS MEALS, HEALTH SCREENINGS, EXERCISE CLASSES, TRIPS AND EDUCATION FOR CHICKASAW AND NATIVE ELDERS.

MORE THAN 3,500 CHICKASAW CITIZENS LIVE IN THE OKLAHOMA CITY AREA.
